Cosmo always stores sharp materials in correct containers Sharps_

- Only handle potentially infectious sharps as outlined in the ECP
- Sharps should be disposed in a properly labeled, puncture and spill resistant container as soon as possible
- Sharps must not be bent or broken
- Do not recap needles
- Do not place fingers or hands inside a sharps container
- Sharps containers should not overflow; do not use hands to transfer sharps

Needle Stick Injuries

Make sure to report all incidents and have the following information on hand:

- Type and brand of device involved
- Department or area where it occurred
- How it happened

Hepatitis B Vaccinations



- Make sure to sign a declination statement if you do not want one
- If you change your mind, the vaccination is still offered

1/3 of all sharps injuries occur during disposal
