What Would Cosmo Do?



Cosmo is trained effectively

Supervisor Drug and Alcohol Suspicion Training

Any CMV driver supervisor must complete an in-person two-hour training on suspected drug and/or alcohol use. The training is:

- A one-time training
- One hour on suspected drug use
- One hour on suspected alcohol use
- Conducted by RMS



Monitoring

Departments shall restrict driving privileges and inform RMS when:

- A driver operates in an unsafe manner, requires retraining, does not complete and follow through with Pre/Post-Trip Inspections, or does not maintain an accurate RODS or Time Log via ELDs or one of the exemptions

Departments shall ensure that vehicle maintenance is performed on a regular basis

Competent Person

Any department who wishes to administer their own truck/trailer practical(s) must be trained and designated by RMS and may only do so once a Competent Person designation Form has been completed

Designated Competent Administrative Person

Any department employee who wishes to become a Designated Competent Administrative Person must be trained and designated by RMS. The department will then be responsible for administering the CMV program for their drivers
